Sports kit for after school and lunch time clubs

Children should not be using bikes or scooters on the playground for safety reasons and they should also not be on the trim trail unsupervised. Young children running around at the time when children come out of school is dangerous and makes it very difficult to ensure the safety of both the school children and the pre-school children. Please keep young children with you where you can ensure that they are safe.
